Measure Description		Using Correct Billing Codes
The percentage of children screened for risk of developmental, behavioral, and social delays using standardized screening tool in the 12 months preceding or on their first, second, or third birthday.		Description Code to identify developmental screening in the first three (3) years of life. Code CPT: 96110
 Documentation in the medical record must include all the following: Date of service when screening test completed, The standardized tool used, and Evidence of screening result or screening score. 		
The following domains must be included in the standardized developmental screening tool: Motor Language Cognitive Social-emotional	Note: The following tools do not meet criteria: Child's Social-Emotional Development (ASQ-SE) or Autism Screening (M-CHAT)

How to Improve HEDIS® Scores

- Use standardized developmental, behavioral, and social delays screening tools.

- Avoid missed opportunities by taking advantage of all visits to complete developmental screening (ages 1, 2, 3).
- Ensure all development screenings include the date screening was completed by the provider.
- Request a focused list of members who need to complete the well-child visit series from your Blue Shield Promise Quality Program Manager.
- Educate staff to schedule visits within guideline time frames.

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
