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## How to Improve HEDIS® Scores

- Avoid missed opportunities by taking advantage of every office visit (including sick visits) to provide a well child visit, immunizations, and lead testing.
- Make daycare physicals into well child visits by performing and documenting the required elements and submitting appropriate codes.
- Ensure that medical records include the date that a health and developmental history and physical exam was performed, and what health education/anticipatory guidance was given.
- Use standardized templates in charts and in electronic medical records (EMRs) that allow checkboxes for standard counseling activities.
- Follow the Bright Futures/American Academy of Pediatrics periodicity schedule.
- Schedule the next well-child visit appointment at the end of the visit.
- Consider after hours/weekend hours to accommodate busy schedules.
- Telehealth visits are also acceptable to meet the measure requirements.
- Request a focused list of members who need to complete the well child visit series from your Blue Shield Promise Quality Program Manager.
